The Mayor of Yarra council and some of the newly elected councillors voted to **dangerously narrow** these bike lanes and reinstate parking, claiming the paths negatively impact local businesses and residents.

But locals and people who ride in the area are worried – this downgrade will discourage cycling, and make it more dangerous.

Our community has a voice: over 1000 people signed a petition in support of our safe bike lanes and 80 people came to council to share their concerns. Sadly, Mayor Stephen Jolly referred to speakers as ‘entitled’ and mocked community members – referring to those who disagree with his jettisoning of safe bike paths as ‘cycling jihadists’ and ‘pricks’ in the press.
